Polished Steel

Commonly termed a "mirror" finish; polished steel is the most reflective finish that is commonly produced. The surface is essentially free of grit lines and reflects the most light. It produces a sharp, crisp look that makes a statement on any product.

Satin Steel

Commonly termed a "brushed" finish; satin steel is a soft finish with a lower reflectivity than polished stainless steel. This finish is often used when a high luster is not desired. It produces a soft, subtle look and doesn't demand to be the center of attention.

Our Statuary Bronze powdercoat is applied to satin steel and is designed to mimic the classic look of bronze that is often used on outdoor statues. Its deep rich hues offer a warm inviting look.
